

Thank you for your interest in Newfoundland Rescue!

As you probably know by now, Newfs are great dogs! They are loving, loyal and boy do they have a reputation around water!

Many people ask to visit our rescue facility. Unfortunately this is impossible as the majority of our dogs are placed in foster homes till they can be placed. But don't worry, we'll make certain you get a chance to meet and interact with the dog before you bring it home!

Newfs, like other dogs, require daily upkeep. They need to be watered, fed, walked, groomed and loved on a daily basis—just like people.

Generally we do not get puppies (dogs under six months of age) in rescue. But don't stop reading! There are some real advantages to older dogs.

1. No housebreaking. Most dogs only need to be shown once or twice where to eliminate.
2. The teeth are in! No teething. This means your good shoes, tables, chairs, etc. are safe from dogs who need to break new teeth.
3. Basic obedience training is done. Many rescues already know how to sit and walk on a leash. Of course we highly recommend you take a basic obedience class with your new dog, but mostly the class will teach the two of you how to work together.
4. Rescue dogs are grateful. Some have had a difficult time, but many have come from loving homes and are thrilled to find a new human to transfer their huge capacity of love to.
5. Discounts! Some obedience clubs offer a discount on classes when you adopt a dog instead of purchasing.
6. You get to feel extra good about yourself because you are taking in a wonderful dog that needs a home.

Please feel free to call or e-mail with questions. Also, I highly recommend that you join us at one of our club events. This will give you an opportunity to talk with other people who have adopted a rescue dog. You get a chance to meet the breed close up and see what wonderful and special dogs Newfoundlands really are.

DO YOU REALLY WANT A NEWFOUNDLAND?

Can you stand hair and slobber? There will be tons of both.

Can you stand having hair and slobber laminated to windows, walls, furniture, light fixtures, etc.?

You cannot be a clean freak.

Do you have the time, patience and ability to train a puppy or retrain a large adult dog?

Perfect Newfs are made, not born. Though benevolent by nature, their gentleness must be enhanced by training. No one wants to be around a spoiled, slobbering, lumbering, jumping dog, no matter how sweet.

Do you have the time and dedication to groom this very high maintenance dog?

They shed a lot, drool a lot, and their skin should be monitored for hot spots, fleas, and itchies. They must be brushed regularly and thoroughly.

Do you have the financial and emotional ability to deal with the health problems a Newfoundland may have?

Though responsible breeders are very careful, health problems do arise. Many minor problems, though icky (like hot spots), can be treated at home.

Do you know which health problems plague this breed?

The main concerns are hearts, hips, elbows, thyroid, eyes and allergies.

Are you committed to approximately ten years of grooming, feeding, and caring for a Newf?

The novelty of brushing wears off quickly. Make sure you are ready for a commitment.

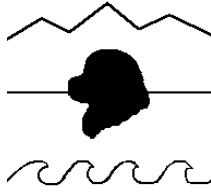
Do you have a fenced, secure, lockable yard?
